HURLSTON HALL

Close to the coastal town of Southport and the vibrant city of Liverpool, Hurlston Hall Golf and Country Club is a resort that is fast becoming a destination hotspot for people travelling to the North West looking for a weekend away with a difference.

Stylish entrepreneur Aoife O'Brien, 30, has been both proprietor and general manager of the resort since 2007. The resort welcomes non-members, societies and corporate and event bookings to play and relax at the club.

The colonial-style clubhouse is built in the same style as the old hall that stood in the same spot that was documented in the Domesday Book. The resort now boasts a luxurious spa, three bars and a restaurant; all perfect for rounding off a day of golf on the infamously challenging 18-hole, par-72 course - designed by the great golf course architect Donald Steel.

Steel, who has worked on the iconic St Andrews golf course and who has been voted the fourth most influential golf architect in the world, has ensured that the course is one of the most challenging in the country. Teeing off at the aptly named first hole 'High Hopes', golfers have their skills tested throughout the course on holes such as 'Lightening Creek' and 'Hallowed Ground'.

Hurlston Hall has a long history of providing the ideal location to hold society events, and proudly welcomes back societies to the resort regularly. The events team work closely with the societies to ensure that the weekend is tailored to their specific needs.

A new onsite golf shop has recently opened stocking the latest golf wear and equipment from brands such as Nike and Ian Poulter. For even more of an advantage, guests can book lessons with the club's professional coaches.

Hurlston Hall has close links with a range of accommodation located near to the resort, including quaint B&B's and local hotels.
